Agriculture and horticulture have one of the worst accident and occupational ill health records of any major employment sector. Over the last ten years there has been on average one death a week, plus many more cases of individuals suffering injuries or ill health as a result of bad working practice. It is therefore essential to address health and safety issues, ensuring the wellbeing of yourself, employees and the general public. Our course will help you to understand the importance of safety requirements and will help address these issues so to make the sector a safer environment to be in.

Who is it for?

Our training course is for you if you currently work in the agriculture or horticulture sector or have an understanding of the sector and would like to pursue a career in it.
