Title: Sit-Astride ATVs including Loads and Trailed Equipment

Type: Training Course

Duration: 1 - 2 Days

Sit-Astride ATVs are very versatile vehicles with a range of attachments including trailers, sprayers and spreaders making them an effective and flexible business tool. However even the most experienced ATV riders can find themselves in a potentially dangerous situation, and without the proper training serious accidents can occur.

Our sit astride ATVs – including Loads and Trailed Equipment course has experienced instructors who will guide you through the training to make sure that you are able to use the sit-astride ATV safely and with confidence, and that the key fundamentals of driving, loading and Health and Safety are covered. Once you have successfully carried out this course you will receive a certificate of training for sit astride ATVs – including Loads and Trailed Equipment.

### Who is it for?

Our sit astride ATVs – including loads and trailed equipment course is for anyone who uses a sit astride ATV as part of their work. This one or two day course is for learners with little experience, however if you are a complete novice you may need three days.

Select and use appropriate personal protective equipment (PPE).

Understand the main causes of accidents.

Start up and drive over a variety of terrain and ground conditions.

Carry out a 'failed hill' climb (full course only).

Carry out a risk assessment and plan the route.

Operate the sit-astride ATV safely on a variety of slopes and terrain (full course only).

Identify loading/towing capacities.

Drive with loads and trailed equipment (full course).

Load and secure for transport on the road (if appropriate).

Understand legal and practical requirements for travelling on the public road.

Load and unload machine from trailer/lorry.
